Note

The 2021 World Anti-Doping Code has introduced the new classification of Protected Person, which is reflected in the Australian National Anti-Doping Policy:

A protected person is an athlete who has been determined to lack legal capacity under applicable national legislation, or an athlete who is under 16; or under 18 and not in any Registered Testing Pool or that has never competed in an open category at an International Event.

A Protected Person who commits an anti-doping rule violation may receive less severe consequences or sanctions, and the details of their violation(s) will ordinarily not be made public. The sanction can range from a reprimand to a maximum ban of 2 years, depending on the level of fault and the type of violation.
